Welcome to the first SLMDA Newsletter for 2016/17 with its new office bearers. It is a great pleasure and an honour to address you as the new president for 2016/17. We are both honoured and privileged to have Professor DYD Samarawickrema continuing as the editor of this great newsletter.

The year started off with a successful Spring Scientific Meeting held at the Park Inn by Radisson which was well attended both by members and non-members. We were able to attract junior doctors both in terms of presenting and attending the meeting. We had a great positive response from those who had attended the meeting with a great majority definitely wanting to attend the meeting next year. We managed to get a healthy balance between invited speakers and junior presentations attracting 3 CPD points.

The meeting was followed by the AGM and the appointments of the new office bearers; we have managed to recruit 3 new Council members, Drs. Roshan Amarasena, Susantha Wijayasiri and Janaka Weerathunga.

We will strive to continue our core functions; book donations to the nine medical and dental faculties under Prof. Samarawickrema and bursaries/ welfare funds to medical faculties under Dr. Jayatunga. We have given a 2 year research grant to Drs. Asanga Fernando and Shivanthi Nayagam for work undertaken in Sri Lanka with CKD and mental health. Following our tour to Sri Lanka in October last year where we visited the Peradeniya, Rajarata, Jaffna and Galle medical faculties, we were able to grant funds for various deserving projects- 2 water purification plants to the Rajarata faculty and the refurbishment of the Jaffna medical students' canteen. We were also able to hold a communication skills workshop in Colombo for the postgraduate trainees.

We had an enjoyable Law-medical encounter with the lawyers clinching the trophy for the cricket 1st XI but drew the cricket 2nd XI. We managed to resurrect the Netball team and managed to clinch the trophy from the very competitive lawyers. There was a friendly tug-o-war which everyone enjoyed and games which the children of the lawyers/ doctors and friends enjoyed.

We are now preparing for our 34th Annual Charity Ball which will be held at the Radisson Edwardian, Heathrow, London on Saturday 1st October and would be grateful for your presence at this event.

Annual Law Medical Cricket Encounter 2016

The Match Report

Summer finally arrived and so did the resurgent legal team for the 13th Law Medical Cricket match on the 16th of July 2016 at the Philatelic Grounds of the Harrow School.

The pitch looked immaculate and the captain of the Law team Ruwan Warnapala had no hesitation electing to bat first. There were several young recruits on both teams eager to showcase their talents.

The Lawyers Flay the Medical Attack

The SLMDA attack missing some of their front line bowlers upfront looked rather innocuous. The youthful new opening partnership of the ASSLL (UK) Jayakrishnan Narayan and Pramesh Adhikari after a rather watchful start soon got the measure of the medical bowlers. They struck out with attacking stroke play and got into a steady stride. For once the spinners on the medical team were unable to ebb the flow of runs.

Records Galore

Young Jayakrishnan never looked in any trouble and marched on to a record score of 150 not out easily the highest score of the Law Medical series. This was riddled with 19 fours and 2 sixes. His partner Pramesh who found fluency in his strokes later on was also just as pugnacious and missed out on a century by 3 runs. He too scored 11 fours and two maximums. The record breaking partnership of 240 runs was finally broken by the persistent veteran Ajantha. The medics were to rue a few chances that were offered.

No. 3 batsman Hasith Senadheera 14 and Harsha Rupasinghe 23 not out chanced their arm in the final overs to push the score to a formidable 303 for two wickets, easily another record for the series.

The only bowlers to impart some control were Ajantha Jayatunga who returned 1 for 46 off 8 and Manoj Wickramasinghe 1 for 40 off 8 overs.

The medics opened with the senior pair of Thilina Ambepitiya and Vinodh Elangasinghe. With only 16 on the board, Thilina was caught at the stumps. Much was expected from the young Sherwyn Fernando who unfortunately fell for two. When Vinod skied one, the writing was on the wall. The other youngster Mudara Senanayake batted on steadily but he fell for 17. Much depended on Youvan but he too fell for 9 runs and the medics were in total disarray with 5 wickets down for 73 runs.

Manoj Fights On

Combining solid defence and attacking forays young Manoj engineered a rear guard action and found an excellent partner in skipper Anura Malaweera. The pair took the score to 194 with another record breaking partnership of 121. Anura succumbed for 37 and Ajantha continued the recovery, rotating the strike allowing Manoj to flourish. With a century in his sights, Manoj was unlucky to fall just short for an excellent 96 runs when he was finally bowled by the nagging Hemantha Warnapala. The final score was 251 for the loss of 7 wickets.

Dr. Don Sarath Munasinghe

MBBS DCH DCCH MSc DME DHMSA FRCGP

8.10.1938 - 27.6.2016

A former President of the SLMDA (2001)

Dr. Don Munasinghe was an outstanding General Practitioner in Strood, Kent for over 33 years. He was a dedicated and a compassionate professional who was highly regarded by his patients and colleagues. He worked in a group practice and was always known for the one to go out of his way to help his patients beyond the call of duty of a GP.

Dr. Munasinghe was educated at the prestigious Royal College in Colombo, and studied medicine at the University of Peradeniya. He migrated to the UK in 1974, and trained in Paediatrics in hospitals in Watford and London. After being successful in the DCH and DCCH examinations, he went into General Practice. After passing his membership examinations and numerous other postgraduate achievements, he went on to guide many Sri Lankan medical colleagues to establish successful careers in the UK.

He was an appraiser for NHS Medway and served for many years as a trainer in general practice. He was responsible for training of some 35 GP vocational trainees and the registrars who became very successful GPs in the UK and abroad. He also trained medical students and trainee nurse practitioners from Kings College and Imperial College, as well as junior doctors at ST1 and ST2 level. In appreciation of his contribution to medical education, the KSS Deanery honoured him with an Educational Award in 2004. As a member of the Committee for Continuing Postgraduate Medical Education in Medway, he contributed to planning and facilitating educational programmes for local General Practitioners and members of the primary care team. He also served as a Board Member in South East Thames Faculty. In 2008, he was awarded the Fellowship of the Royal College of General Practitioners. He was nominated by a local Counsellor for the Best of Health Awards for Health and Social Care. In 2014, he was nominated the "Health and Hospital Champion" in the *Pride of Medway Awards*.

He participated in many voluntary, charitable and social organizations both in his local community and amongst the wider Sri Lankan community. He will be fondly remembered as the 'Singing Doctor' as he was a talented musician. He has produced several songs in both Sinhala and English, and made multiple appearances on television and radio shows both in Sri Lanka and in the UK. His stewardship of the SLMDA will be remembered for setting a new standard in cultural and social activities, and for raising considerable funds for the organization.

After a long battle with Parkinson's disease, he sadly passed away at the end of June. He is missed by so many, and is an immeasurable loss to the professional Sri Lankan community.
